

Then I'll review the final-final book, Book 11, which finishes up the whole shebang.



I'd like to get another Classics mystery written, perhaps later next year, and review another one to submit to my editor. I finished edits for *Pried* but haven't seen the cover yet (nail-biting time). It's about time for me to submit a new one if I want to have two books out next year.

I also need to work on my Writing Business Stuff. I want to reformat and re-launch some of those books that were returned to me. They'll need new covers, a bit of editing, and promo, of course. That's going to be quite a lot of work, I fear.

Plus I still want to look at setting up my own "company" (an LLC), and figure out the copyright and other legal aspects.

And there's the holidays. My celebrations are pretty low-key, but I still want to kick back and relax and enjoy it, especially since I'm now working again.
