In Other News

On the writing front, I'm almost done with my major review of the books in the Endless Dream series. I finished reviewing the 3 books in the Celestial Service series, and I've reviewed 6 of the 9 in the Dream series. Once those are done, I'll review the 2 additional books (future generations) and the 3 books in the New Human series which wraps up the entire thing.

As I said in my last newsletter, I'm using a new process for reviews, uploading a copy of my manuscripts to "the cloud", then annotating them online. I discovered I have a propensity for long sentences--I use a lot of "and" and "but". I don't know why I never noticed this before. This time, during the review, it leapt out at me.

I have a list of abused words that I keep, and I'm going to need to add those to it. There are also some other minor things I want to fix--what should be capitalized ("interstate" -- capitalized all the time or just when it refers to a specific road, like Interstate 80?); double-checking all the "facts" in the story (was she married for 6 years or 7?)

I keep track of all those facts in a Wiki I created. I think I'm going to migrate that to another system soon. I'm verifying everything then I may begin the process of moving the information elsewhere. There's a lot of design work to be done before I start to do it, things to consider for cross-referencing, indexing, and linking (not to mention just the sheer number of "pages"). It's a big move, but I have the time to do it now. The Wiki has served me well, but it is time-consuming to maintain. It's like a giant website with a lot of sub-pages, and I have to manage it all. I think if I shift it elsewhere, it might be easier to handle.

What's Next?

I sent in my Snow White book (*Mirrored*) to my editor and it was accepted for publication -- this is my Snow White and the Seven Jocks book, in which Snow becomes a target of a deranged convict. The hero, Brendan Royal, is not only an FBI agent but a gifted amateur musical theater actor. I had a lot of fun pairing a woman who loves country music with a man who sings the lead in plays like *Showboat* and *Oklahoma!* It will be out next year.

I also want to transfer some of my self-published books from one distributor (Smashwords) to another (Draft2Digital). It's all behind-the-scenes stuff for the reader but for an author, it means I'll have all my books in one place where I can manage them. Speaking of managing--

I got all of my books set up on a new site that lists all the distribution for each book (Apple, Amazon, etc.) https://books2read.com/rl/JLWilsonReadingList. I no longer have to maintain a list of links for each book. Believe me, it makes my life a lot easier! In between all of that, I'd like to continue working on cover ideas for the Dream series, which I'd like to self-publish starting next year. Yep. It's a good thing I retired. Now I have the time.
