The merger will begin in March and probably take a few months to complete. It makes my life much easier!

I decided to revisit my backlist of books on my Facebook author page. Every week I'm going to have a post that talks about one of the "old" books. I am about half-way done with writing my next mystery. This is my Little Red Riding Hood book in which the heroine is in danger from someone with a grudge about organ donations. I started thinking about how I could refactor that into a plot and my gambling buddies helped me come up with the idea of organ donations. The book is progressing nicely and I hope to wrap it up by the end of this month.

Next I want to decide on a book to submit to my publisher. Should I have Jane Eyre, Rapunzel, Cinderella, or Little Briar Rose release next? Decisions, decisions.

What's Next?

I'm starting Year 15 in publishing and this is the year I want to release my big series. I'm working on cover art for the whole series:

- 3 books in the Celestial Service series
- 9 books in The Sorting (formerly The Endless American Dream)
- 3 books in The Memories (the later generations)
- 3 books in the New Human series (set on another planet)

My goal is to release one a month starting in August. I'm not 100% sure I can make that deadline because it depends on how the cover art development goes, how things look when I do my read-through later this spring, and so on. But that's my goal (it's good to have goals, right?)



I've been working on this series *forever* and I never actually thought about the day I might publish it. That day always seemed so far in the future. But I'm hoping this year is the year I launch it.

But first I need to finish the book I'm working on. I need to decide on a new book to submit to my editor. I need to figure out what I want on 18 covers for 4 different-yet-related series of books. Then I can sit back, review everything I've worked on, upload it and see if I like it and then – maybe – set a publishing date.

We'll see what happens!
