So I decided that I'll get the covers designed and format the books but I won't plan to release the books until I feel good and ready. I still have the final 3 books in the series to review, and that may necessitate me going back and tweaking yet more things. We'll see!

In Other News


I'm beginning year 16 in publishing – amazing, isn't it? I'm averaging about two books per year (all books are listed at https://bit.ly/JLWbooks.) I'll be adding *Heir* to that list this year.

Yep, my Rapunzel book will be coming out sometime this year. And I have a preliminary cover for it already (that was fast!) I think it will be altered slightly to include a bloody fingerprint on the upper half (consistent with some of my other covers).

This is one of the few books I didn't set exclusively in the Midwest and I can't remember exactly why I chose to set it elsewhere. I tend to use places that I can easily identify and map out, but for this one I made up an entire town and plopped my characters right into it.

I did a lot of psychological research for this book because the main character was kept secluded from interacting with other people for the first sixteen years of her life. I needed to know what effect that would have on her world view.

It's a bit creepy to realize that there's an entire body of research devoted to this topic because it's happened and

I did start my story in Iowa and my heroine does own a store much like one I've visited in the Amana Colonies here. So there's still that Midwest touch. I have a couple of very interesting characters in this one, especially a stepsister who shows up late in the show and who may get her own book at some time in the future or who may appear in other books.



I need to mess around with some Publishing Business. I have an author page on Amazon (https://www.amazon.com/author/j_l_wilson), created by Amazon. I can edit it, but ... I haven't done much with it. So I'll look at that. I also want to make sure I have up-to-date print editions for my self-published books.

Then I may fool around with audio for some of my books. That can be costly but I have an offer from a distributor to be a beta tester for one of their audio conversion programs. And of course there's writing. I'll tackle *The Scarlet Letter* next, work on some novellas, and think about how to handle my series. There's always something new-to-do in my stack!
